### A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Social Host – Unruly Social Gatherings

FOR the purpose of eliminating Social Host – Unruly Social Gatherings as a pilot program and expanding the boundaries of the program county-wide; repealing an uncodified sunset provision; and generally relating to Social Host – Unruly Social Gatherings.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

Sections 13-7-132(a) and 13-7-133

Article 13 – Public Health, Safety, and the Environment

Title 7 – Nuisances

Subtitle 1 – General Nuisances on Private Property and on Public Roads

Baltimore County Code, 2015

BY repealing

Section 2 of Bill 68-17, which amended Bill 90-15, as amended by Bill 68-17

11	§ 13-7-132. General Prohibition.						
12	(a) A property owner or any responsible person may not conduct, cause, aid, allow,						
13	permit, or condone an unruly social gathering at a residence or other private property located in						
14	the [pilot program area identified in section] COUNTY, AND MAY BE ISSUED A CITATION						
15	IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 13-7-133 of this Part IV of this subtitle.

17	§ 13-7-133. [Pilot Program] ISSUANCE OF CITATION FOR UNRULY SOCIAL						
18	GATHERING.						
19	(a) [The "pilot program area" for this Part IV of this subtitle means:						
20	(1) The areas of Greater Towson encompassed within the Towson Precinct						
21	(Precinct 6) of the Baltimore County Police Department; and						
22	(2) The area of Arbutus consisting of the area north of Selford Road and South						
23	Rolling Road, east and south of Wilkens Avenue, south of Maiden Choice Lane, west of Leeds						

1	Avenue, Linden Avenue, and East Drive, and north of Sulphur Spring Road at its intersection					
2	with Selford Road.					
3	(b)] In addition to any other civil or criminal penalties, if a Police Officer who responds					
4	to a residence or other private property [within the pilot program area] determines that an unruly					
5	social gathering exists in violation of § 13-7-132(a) of this Part IV of this subtitle, the Police					
6	Officer may issue a civil citation for the violation to all identified responsible persons.					
7	[(c)] (B) If a citation is issued according to subsection [(b)] (A), the Police Officer,					
8	within 30 days of the issuance of the citation to the responsible persons, shall:					
9	(1) For the first violation of § 13-7-132(a) of this Part IV of this subtitle, serve a					
10	warning on the property owner in accordance with § 13-7-113(c) of this Part II of this subtitle;					
11	and					
12	(2) For the second and subsequent violations of § 13-7-132(a) of this Part IV of					
13	this subtitle, serve a civil citation on the property owner.
